

Charter Ordinance C-4

To Permit One Person, Except in Certain Cases,
To Hold Two or More Village Offices.

The Village Board of Oconomowoc Lake do ordain
as follows:

(1) Pursuant to Article XI, Section 3, Wisconsin Constitution, and Section 66.01, Wisconsin Statutes, the Village of Oconomowoc Lake determines and elects that the common-law doctrine of incompatibility of municipal offices shall not apply in any form or manner to its organization or operation, so that one person may legally occupy any two or more village offices or positions except as otherwise specifically provided in legislative enactments of state-wide concern that affect every village with uniformity.

(2) Charter Ordinance C-3, adopted by the Village of Oconomowoc Lake on June 5, 1960 is hereby repealed.

Passed and adopted by a vote of two-thirds of the Village Board of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake, Waukesha County, Wisconsin, this 21st day of August, 1961.


CHARTER ORDINANCE C-4


(1) Opposite the entrance to the Oconomowoc Lake Club on the northern side of the road in front of the Club.
