

CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. C-7

A CHARTER ORDINANCE ABOLISHING THE OFFICE
OF "ELECTIVE VILLAGE TREASURER" AND CREATING
THE OFFICE OF "APPOINTIVE VILLAGE TREASURER"
AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPOINTMENT AND TENURE OF
THE OFFICE OF VILLAGE TREASURER

The Village Board of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake, Waukesha County, Wisconsin, pursuant to Sections 61.195, 61.197 and 66.01 of the Wisconsin Statutes, does ordain as follows:

Section 1: STATUTES NOT TO GOVERN. The Village of Oconomowoc Lake, pursuant to Sections 61.01, 61.195, 61.197 and 66.01 of the Wisconsin Statutes hereby elects not to be governed by those portions of Sections 61.19 and 61.23 of the Wisconsin Statutes which relate to the selection and tenure of the Village Treasurer and which are in conflict with this ordinance.

Section 2: ELECTIVE VILLAGE TREASURER. The elective office of the Treasurer of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake is hereby abolished.

Section 3: APPOINTED VILLAGE TREASURER. Commencing May 1, 1995, the office of appointed Village Treasurer is hereby created.

- (a) APPOINTMENT: The office of Village Treasurer shall hereafter be performed by the person nominated by the Village Board and elected by a majority vote of all members of the Village Board pursuant to Section 61.197(1)(c) of the Wisconsin Statutes.
- (b) TERM: The appointed Village Treasurer shall hold the office at the will of the Village Board, subject to removal at the pleasure of the Village Board, by a majority vote of all members of the Village Board pursuant to Section 17.13(1) of the Wisconsin Statutes.
- (c) DUTIES: The appointed Village Treasurer shall perform all those duties required of the office of Treasurer as may be provided by law or by any ordinance or other directive of the Village Board.

Section 4: INCUMBENT. This ordinance shall not in any way affect the right of any person whose term of office has commenced but

has not expired on the effective date of this ordinance to complete the term of office.

Section 5: SEVERABILITY. The several sections of this ordinance are declared to be severable. If any section or portion thereof shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unlawful or unenforceable, such decision shall apply only to the specific section or portion thereof directly specified in the decision, and shall not affect the validity of any other provisions, sections or portions thereof of the ordinance. The remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. Any other ordinances whose terms are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to those terms that conflict.

Section 6: EFFECTIVE DATE. This is a charter ordinance and shall take effect 60 days after its passage and publication unless within such 60 day period a referendum petition as provided by Section 66.01 of the Wisconsin Statutes shall be filed, in which event this ordinance shall not take effect until it shall have been submitted to a referendum vote of the electors and approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.

Passed and adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members-elect of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake this 27th day of January, 1995.
