

ORDINANCE # 102

An Ordinance to Regulate Sewerage
Service

The Village Board of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake, Waukesha County, Wisconsin, does hereby adopt the following ordinance for the regulation of sewerage service:

1. City of Oconomowoc Ordinance Adopted.

All provisions of the City of Oconomowoc ordinance describing and defining regulations with respect to Sewerage Service, including penalties to be imposed and procedure for prosecution are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this ordinance as if fully set forth herein. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by any provisions incorporated herein by reference is required or prohibited by this ordinance.

The provisions of the City of Oconomowoc ordinance adopted by reference shall include but not be limited to the following:

- 13.25 Definitions
- 13.26 Use of Public Sewers
- 13.27 Control of Industrial Wastes Directed
to Public Sewers
- 13.28 Sewer Construction
- 13.36 Right of Entry, Safety and Identification
- 13.37 Damage or Tampering with Sewage Works
- 13.38 Violations and Penalties
- 13.39 Delinquent Utility Accounts
- 13.40 Penalties

2. References. References to specific sections of the City of Oconomowoc ordinances shall mean the ordinances in effect on


December 31, 1985, and all amendments thereto.

3. Conflicting Ordinances. Ordinances passed by the Village Board of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake, which are in conflict with this ordinance shall be controlling.

4. Severability. The provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the Village Board would have passed the other provisions of this ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid and if any provision of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force upon passage and posting.
