

ORDINANCE NO. 125

AN ORDINANCE TO DESIGNATE A PORTION OF WATERTOWN PLANK ROAD  
IN THE VILLAGE OF OCONOMOWOC LAKE AS A PEDESTRIAN MALL  
PURSUANT TO SECTION 66.298, WISCONSIN STATUTES

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake has determined that a portion of Watertown Plank Road should be closed to vehicular traffic; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Oconomowoc Lake does not presently wish to vacate or otherwise abandon this portion of Watertown Plank Road; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Oconomowoc Lake wishes to allow this section of Watertown Plank Road to remain open to pedestrian traffic and other non-vehicular traffic;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Village Board of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake, Waukesha County, State of Wisconsin DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. An ordinance designating a portion of Watertown Plank Road as a pedestrian mall pursuant to Section 66.298, Wisconsin Statutes, is hereby created to read as follows:

DESIGNATION OF PEDESTRIAN MALL. The following section of Watertown Plank Road in the Village of Oconomowoc Lake is hereby designated a pedestrian mall pursuant to Section 66.298, Wisconsin Statutes:

INSERT LEGAL DESCRIPTION

GENERAL RESTRICTIONS. No person shall operate any automobile, truck, motorcycle, snowmobile, all-terrain vehicle or other motorized or motor-driven vehicle upon the above-designated portion of Watertown Plank Road.

PENALTIES.

Any person over the age of 17 years violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$200.00 plus costs per each offense. Failure to pay any forfeiture hereunder shall subject any violator over the age of 17 years to be sentenced to the County Jail until such forfeiture is paid, but not to exceed ninety (90) days.

Any person between the ages of 14 and 17 shall be subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$25.00 plus costs per each offense or referred to the proper authorities as provided in Chapter 48, Wisconsin Statutes. Failure to pay any forfeiture hereunder shall subject the violator to the provisions of Section 48.17(2), Wisconsin Statutes.

Any person under the age of 14 years shall be referred to the proper authorities as provided in Chapter 48, Wisconsin Statutes.

SECTION 2: SEVERABILITY.

The several sections of this ordinance are declared to be severable. If any section or portion thereof shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unlawful or unenforceable, such decision shall apply only to the specific section or portion thereof directly specified in the decision, and shall not affect the validity of any other provisions, sections or portions thereof of the ordinance. The remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. Any other ordinances whose terms are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to those terms that conflict.

SECTION 3: EFFECTIVE DATE.


This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and posting or publication as provided by law.
