ORDINANCE NO. 209

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE
VILLAGE-OWNED WATER FRONTAGE

WHEREAS, certain lands are owned by the Village of Oconomowoc Lake; and

WHEREAS, the public health and safety of the residents of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake makes it imperative for the Village to adopt certain rules and regulations concerning the use of Village-owned property, in order to ensure the public safety and to provide for the orderly and peaceful use thereof by the Village residents,

WHEREAS, on or about August 28, 2000, the Village Board adopted ordinance No. 186 to regulate Village owned water frontage, which the Village now intends to re-create with the inclusion of a penalty provision that would apply for violation of the ordinance,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Village Board for the Village of Oconomowoc Lake, Waukesha County, Wisconsin DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Repeal Ordinance 186. Village of Oconomowoc Lake Ordinance No. 186 entitled "An Ordinance to Regulate Village-Owned Water Frontage", dated on or about August 28, 2000, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2: Piers. There shall be no piers or wharfs constructed on or immediately contiguous to Village-owned property without specific approval of the Village Board, Village Administrator or designee.

SECTION 3: No Docking, Mooring or Storage. No overnight docking of boats shall be permitted along Village-owned property, but docking of boats other than overnight docking of boats shall be permitted along Village-owned property with specific approval of the Village Board, Village Administrator or designee.

SECTION 4: Swimming. There shall be no wading, swimming or diving from Village-owned property without specific approval of the Village Board, Village Administrator or designee.

SECTION 5: Penalties. Any person, firm or corporation who fails to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof forfeit not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) and costs of prosecution

for each violation and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs shall be imprisoned in the County Jail until payment thereof, but not exceeding thirty (30) days.

SECTION 6: SEVERABILITY.

The several sections of this ordinance are declared to be severable. If any section or portion thereof shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unlawful or unenforceable, such decision shall apply only to the specific section or portion thereof directly specified in the decision, and shall not affect the validity of any other provisions, sections or portions thereof of the ordinance. The remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. Any other ordinances whose terms are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to those terms that conflict.

SECTION 7: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and posting or publication as provided by law.


AFFIDAVIT OF POSTING

to-wit:


- (1) Opposite the entrance to the Oconomowoc Lake Club on the northern side of the road in front of the Club;
