

ORDINANCE NO. 226AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT THE  
NATIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM AS A BASIS FOR ALL INCIDENT  
MANAGEMENT IN THE VILLAGE OF OCONOMOWOC LAKE

**WHEREAS**, the President of the United States and Homeland Security Directive (“HSPD”)-5, directed the Secretary of the United States Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a comprehensive National Incident Management System (“NIMS”), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach for federal, state, local and tribal governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents regardless of their cause, magnitude or complexity; and

**WHEREAS**, collaboration by and among all federal, state, local and tribal homeland security partners has been, and will continue to be, vital to the effective development, implementation and utilization of the NIMS; and

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary and appropriate that all federal, state, local and tribal emergency service agencies coordinate their efforts in order to effectively and efficiently provide optimal levels of incident management; and

**WHEREAS**, to effectively and efficiently manage incidents it is critical that federal, state, local and tribal public safety organizations utilize standardized terminologies, integrated organizational structures, interoperable communications, consolidated action plans, unified incident command structures, uniform personnel qualification standards, common standards for planning, training and exercising, comprehensive resource management, and designated incident facilities during emergencies or disasters; and

**WHEREAS**, the NIMS standardized procedures for managing personnel, communications, facilities and resources will improve the ability of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake to utilize federal and state grant funding to enhance local agency readiness, maintain first responder preparedness and streamline incident management processes; and

**WHEREAS**, the incident command system (“ICS”) components of the NIMS are already an integral part of various incident management activities throughout Waukesha County and the State of Wisconsin, including current emergency management training programs; and

**WHEREAS**, the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks (9-11 Commission) recommended adoption of a standardized ICS throughout the nation.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the Village Board of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake, Waukesha

County, Wisconsin, **DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

SECTION 1: The National Incident Management System is hereby established as the Village of Oconomowoc Lake's standard for incident management as described above.

SECTION 2: SEVERABILITY


The several sections of this ordinance are declared to be severable. If any section or portion thereof shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unlawful or unenforceable, such decision shall apply only to the specific section or portion thereof directly specified in the decision, and shall not affect the validity of any other provisions, sections or portions thereof of the ordinance. The remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. Any other ordinances whose terms are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to those terms that conflict.

SECTION 3: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and posting or publication as provided by law.
