Ordinance No. 43

To Regulate the Use of Frozen Lakes and Rivers
and Prescribing Penalties for Violation there-
of _____

The Village Board of Oconomowoc Lake, deeming it to be in the interest of public health and safety, do ordain as follows:

(1) ICE FISHING. No person shall make or cause to be made any hole more than twelve (12) inches in diameter or more than one (1) foot square in area for the purpose of fishing through the ice on any portion of the lakes adjacent to or within the Village of Oconomowoc Lake and under the jurisdiction of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake.

(2) DRIVING AND PARKING VEHICLES ON THE ICE. No person shall drive or permit to be driven any automobile or other motor vehicle upon the ice on any portion of the lakes or other water adjacent to or within the Village of Oconomowoc Lake and under the jurisdiction of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake at any time except upon a permit issued by the Chief of Police upon application showing that there is some urgent reason or need therefore.

(3) PENALTY. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) plus the costs of prosecution, and upon default of immediate payment of such fine and costs, shall be imprisoned in the County jail until payment of such forfeiture and costs is made, but not exceeding thirty (30) days.

(4) All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

(5) EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force after its passage and posting.

Annexation of Certain Contiguous Territory


