

ORDINANCE NO. 83

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE DEPOSITING OF
SNOW ON PUBLIC STREETS WITHIN THE
VILLAGE OF OCONOMOWOC LAKE

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake do
ordain as follows:

1. No person shall push, shovel, plow or otherwise deposit
snow from any driveway or property upon or into the roadway of
any public street within the Village limits of the Village of
Oconomowoc Lake.

2. Any person who shall violate any provision of this ordin-
ance shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit not less than \$25 nor
more than \$100, together with the costs of prosecution.

3. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict with
the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and
after the passage and publication as provided by law.
