

~~Gallauer seconded and CARRIED as follows: "Resolved, that Mr. Lowry be authorized to advise Mr. Jamme of the problem and request his recommendation."~~ ①

The bridges have been surveyed but the results are not automatically furnished to the Village. Mr. Johnson will attempt to obtain a copy. Mr. Johnson has the name of a man from the Bridge Dept. for the Dept. of Transportation who would assist the Village in applying for federal and state aid for bridges for possible replacement of the wooden overhead railroad bridge, the theory being that the bridge must be built at some future time anyway for the tie-in to Hwy. 67.

Regarding clarification of Village snowplowing duties, Mr. Johnson said he was unable to have a committee meeting but after consultation with Mr. Riehle, he suggests the following: The Village Board hereby directs the Village Administrator to follow this future policy of snowplowing: Open all residents' driveways to allow ingress and egress. When this is completed, return and do clean-up work. Push snow back and allow for additional snow so there will be a place to put it in the future."

Mr. Gallauer said this does not address itself to the problem of residents demanding extra clean-up that they should accomplish on their own. Mr. Johnson also suggested consideration of the following ordinance: "Residents of Oconomowoc Lake or their agents shall not push, shovel, throw or blow snow on the Village roads."

Mr. Lowry suggested the committee do further study and have their proposal in by the October meeting so a public hearing could be held in November and passed before the snow season begins. It was felt the men who snowplow should carry a copy of their exact duties so they could inform residents that it is against the rules if they are requested to do extra clean-up.

Regarding the petition for closing No. Beach and West Beach Roads, Mr. Johnson questioned whether taking traffic counts would be of any specific value. Mr. Lowry said problems in closing the roads would be complex and described some of the major difficulties that would be faced. Mr. Lowry wondered if it would be possible to determine whether a resolution was ever passed removing West Beach and No. Beach Rds. from the County trunk system. If such resolution was passed, it would be buried in the minutes of past years and finding it would be a cumbersome task. Mr. Lowry recommended that a protective resolution be considered, made on the basis that it will be on record in the event there is not another in the minutes. He said no public hearing is necessary. Mr. Gallauer moved the following resolution be adopted:

~~"It is hereby resolved that roads in the Village of Oconomowoc Lake known as West Beach Rd. and North Beach Road and Gifford Rd. shall be, have been, and hereby are removed from the County trunk system."~~ ②

The resolution was seconded and CARRIED. Mr. Lowry has reviewed the submitted petition and says it does not meet requirements of Section 66,296 Wis. Stats. dealing with procedure for vacating roads and thus requires no specific action. The matter remains in the Public Works Committee.
