A RESOLUTION CONCERNING PARTICIPATION IN  
COUNTY 911 EMERGENCY PHONE SERVICE

WHEREAS, Planning of a County-wide system requires that the Village of Oconomowoc Lake designate a Public Safety Answering Point to receive all of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake emergency 9-1-1 telephone requests for law enforcement, fire fighting, medical and ambulance services;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED By the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Oconomowoc Lake that the Waukesha County Sheriff Department be designated as the Village of Oconomowoc Lake 9-1-1 Public Safety Answering Point, with all 9-1-1 calls for the Village of Oconomowoc Lake being transferred by the Sheriff's Department to the City of Oconomowoc Dispatch Center.

4) Mr. Wiemer would like to repave North Beach Road as soon as possible with West Beach Road to follow. With the increase in traffic, Mr. Roberts feels we should "beef up" these roads now to protect them. Trucks have already damaged some of the roads around the construction areas. This matter was remanded to the Finance Committee.

COMMUNICATIONS: 1) Letter from C. D. Besadny of the DNR, dated September 23, 1988, regarding water levels on Okauchee, Oconomowoc and Fowler Lakes, Lac LaBelle and the Oconomowoc River. State Statutes require that dams must pass 25% of the minimum low flow at all times to protect the downstream aquatic environment. The goal is to develop a flow regime which will ensure enough flow for navigational purposes and protection of the fisheries resource and the area's wetlands. Mr. Besadny has asked that the Southeast District Water Regulation and Zoning and Fisheries Management Sections meet with the Village and other area officials to explain their evaluations and to develop minimum flow values which will satisfy all concerns.

2) Letter from Sherman Jacobs of the Department of Revenue, dated September 21, 1988, regarding the review of commercial class properties in the Village which will take place at this time.

3) Letter from the County Clerk dated October 12, 1988, following up on County Board Chairman Finley's correspondence of September 8, 1988, regarding our municipality's legislation to designate a 9-1-1 Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) by November 14, 1988. Our closest PSAP would be the City of Delafield; the City of Oconomowoc does not plan to be one. So far our emergency calls go to the Waukesha Sheriff's Dept. which, in turn, will forward the calls into Oconomowoc to reach us. The cost to Oconomowoc to be a PSAP would be about \$70,000, Mr. Wiemer said, and they don't want to incur this expense for nine communities.

Upon motion by Mr. Clayton, seconded by Mr. Meyer, and CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY, the following resolution regarding the 9-1-1 System was adopted:

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
